

Dyschoriste oblongifolia

Twinflower



Dyschoriste is a herbaceous perennial, native to the pine forests of southeastern United States. Trumpet-shaped purple flowers cover the plants in late spring through fall. Buckeye butterflies lay eggs on Twinflower. (If you notice chewing damage on the leaves then more butterflies should be sharing your garden with you in a couple of weeks.) *D. oblongifolia* naturalizes well and, when spaced 8” apart, makes an excellent groundcover. Drought tolerant, needs well-drained soil and prefers acidic, sandy soil. Requires full sun to partial shade.

Height: 6” – 10” Spread: 12” – 18”
