

Liriodendron tulipifera

Tulip or Yellow Poplar



This fast growing native of the Southeast has interesting foliage and flowers, each having a tulip shape. Noted by many for the spectacular fall color. This species of *Liriodendron* is for large sites where its stately beauty may be enjoyed. For smaller sites or for street use there are cultivars that will reach less grand measurements. Two species of butterflies, both the tiger and spicebush swallowtail, often lay eggs on tulip poplar. The species attracts squirrels and birds, including hummingbirds. Plant in full sun, moderate water requirements.

Height: 80'–100' or more Spread: 35'–50'
