

Penstemon multiflorus
Manyflower Beardtongue



The showy spikes of white flowers top these perennials in early summer. Best growth is in full sun or light shade, in sandy soil. The name beardtongue comes from the hairs on the sterile stamen. The basal leaves form a rosette, which has remained green through the winter in the NESPAL landscape. The undersides of the leaves are reddish to green. Manyflower beardtongue will grow in dry soil, and fits well in a xeriscape setting.

Height: 2' – 4'

Spread 1' – 2'
